Compensation. **Sec. 3.** The said commissioners shall be entitled to a reasonable compensation for their services and expenses in viewing and laying out said road, to be allowed by the board of supervisors of the several counties through which said road may pass, to be paid out of the treasury of such counties: *Provided*, That no part of said expenses shall be paid by the state.

Proviso.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
Approved, February 5, 1855.

Chapter 35.

An Act to incorporate the Salem Academy.

*aka Libbournes
Cong Church
School*

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Salem academy.

SECTION 1. That Thomas Tenney, Horace Batricke, William Munson, Daniel Wallis, Hiram S. Munson, Arthur Penney, Edwin Munson, Alanson Orton, Lemuel Booth, Eleazer S. Ingalls, Johnson Bliss, Harrison Robbins, Jacob Down, E. Dwight Robbins, Agustin G. Hibbard, John Tuttle, David B. Bunham, Isaac Brown and their successors, be, and hereby are created a body politic and corporate, to be styled; "The board of trustees of the Salem Academy," and by that name to remain in perpetual succession with full powers to sue, and be sued; to plead and be impleaded; to acquire, hold and convey property, real and personal, to have, and use a common seal, to alter and renew the same at pleasure; to make, and alter from time to time such lawful regulations, as they may deem necessary for the government for said Academy, its officers, and servants; and to have power to confer on those whom they deem worthy, all such honors and degrees, as are usually conferred in like institutions, *Provided*, that the real and personal estate to be held by this corporation shall not exceed the sum of fifty thousand dollars.

Proviso.

Location.

Sec. 2. That the said Academy, shall be located in the town of Salem, county of Kenosha, State of Wisconsin, upon such grounds as the trustees shall select. The object of

the institution shall be to afford instruction in English Literature, in the ancient and modern languages, in mathematics and the natural sciences in the art of teaching, and the application of science to agriculture and the mechanic arts. Object of institution.

SEC. 3. That the board of trustees, shall have power to appoint a president, secretary and treasurer, and such agents as they may deem necessary, and shall fill all vacancies as they may occur in their own body, by resignation, death, or neglect for more than one year to attend to the duties of trustee; also to appoint such officers, professors and teachers, as the institution and government of the institution shall require, and prescribe their duties, and remove any of them for sufficient reasons: also to prescribe and direct the course of study, to be pursued in the institution and its departments. Board of trustees.

SEC. 4. That the board of trustees, shall consist of fifteen, with power to increase to eighteen, a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum to do business. Said Board of trustees shall hold their first annual meeting, the last Tuesday in April 1855, and afterwards they shall meet on their own adjournment, but in case of any special business, the president with the concurrence of two trustees, may call a meeting or any five members of the board may call a meeting, by giving public notice of the same, at least six days before the time of such meeting. Number of trustees.

SEC. 5. That the board of trustees shall faithfully apply all funds by them collected or received, according to their best judgment, in erecting suitable buildings, supporting the necessary officers, instructors, and servants, in procuring books and apparatus necessary to the success of the institution. *Provided, nevertheless:* That in case any donation or bequest be made for particular purposes, which accord with the design of the institution, and the corporation shall receive and accept the same; every donation or bequest thus made shall be applied in conformity to the conditions or designs expressed by the donor. Proviso.

SEC. 6. That the trustees of the corporation, shall always, and all other agents when required, before entering upon the duties of their appointment, give bond, for the security of the corporation, and of the public, in such penal sum, and with such sureties as the corporation shall approve.

SEC. 7. That the said institution shall be open to all denominations of christians, and the profession of any religious faith shall not be required of those who become

students. Any person, however may be suspended or expelled from said institution, whose habits are idle or vicious, or whose moral character is bad.

Approved, February 6, 1855.

Chapter 36.

An Act to incorporate the Janesville Collegiate Institute.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Created a body corporate.

SECTION 1. Hiram Foote, Orin Densmore, Wm. A. Lawrence, S. A. Martin, J. J. R. Pease, J. H. Budd, J. B. Crosby, Thomas Armstrong, E. L. Harris, J. F. Willard, Andrew Palmer, O. N. Gorton, W. H. Douglass, O. J. Dearborn, G. S. Dodge, and their successors shall be, and they are hereby created and constituted a body politic and corporate, to be styled "The Janesville Collegiate Institute," to remain in perpetual succession, and shall be trustees of said corporation until their successors are duly elected and qualified; the design and purpose of said corporation being to found, establish and maintain in the city of Janesville, an institution of science, literature, and learning of the highest order, embracing an academical and preparatory department of instruction.

Number of trustees.

SEC. 2. That the board of trustees shall consist of twenty-one members—one of whom shall be chosen to act as president of the board, until a collegiate faculty shall have been duly chosen, and organized as hereinafter provided, then the president thereof shall be ex-officio the twenty second trustee, and president of the board. The trustees shall be divided into three classes, seven in each class, and the office of the trustees of the first class shall expire at the time of the first annual meeting of the board thereafter, and the office of trustees of the second class, shall expire at the time of the second, and the office of trustees of the third class, at the time of the third annual meeting of the board; and the office of the trustees of one class shall expire annually thereafter in rotation. The board shall have power at any annual meeting to reduce the num-

the Hudson river to Troy, N. Y., and thence by canal-boat on the Erie canal to Utica, where they landed on the 4th of July. The boat stopped there for a short while, during which occurred an incident which Mr. Williams is fond of relating to this day. Some young men were firing a cannon to celebrate the "Glorious Fourth" and, in fun, fired a paper wad at the boat. The paper ball passed between Mr. Williams and a gentleman with whom he was conversing on the upper deck, and struck a young woman in the breast, knocking her senseless. She was not injured, however, and regained consciousness quickly. The rest of the trip was made by way of the Great Lakes. At Mackinaw the boat took fire, but by hard work the flames were extinguished without damage worth mentioning, the event occasioning considerable excitement, however. The boat finally reached Southport safely, making dock some time in the latter part of July, 1842.

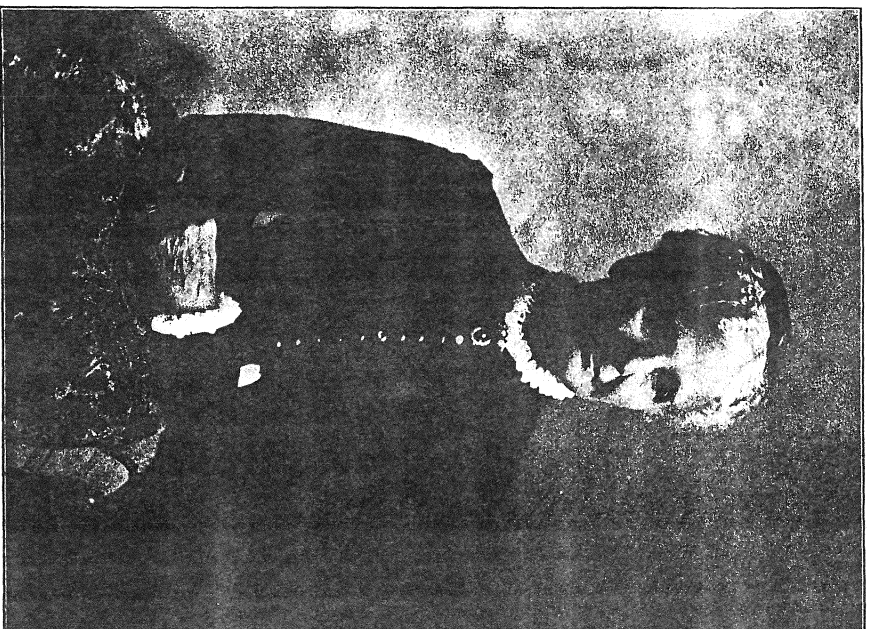
Although past his eighty-first year Daniel Williams is quite strong and rugged and is in full possession of all of his faculties. He is a good conversationalist and entertainer, but besides this has many other admirable qualities, being above all a man of honor and integrity, highly esteemed by his neighbors and acquaintances. He is as well posted on early events as on current happenings, and being one of the pioneers who have helped to develop the country his history should be imperishably preserved for the benefit of the coming generations. He is one of that class of sturdy Welsh stock with which one cannot help but be impressed favorably, on account of their individuality and independence of character. Of such material are pioneers made. Mr. Williams may well be termed a self-made man, as he has, through his own industry and good management, succeeded in the affairs of life and accumulated a competency for old age. He is recognized as one of the intelligent and practical farmers of Kenosha county, and would be a credit to any community in which his lot might be cast. His wife has been his faithful help-mate during all his struggles, and justly deserves to share the respect and esteem accorded her husband, with whom she has trod the path of life for forty-eight happy years.

FRANK G. HARTNELL, of Brighton township, Kenosha county, was born June 17, 1855, on the same farm where he now lives, son of John and Eliza (Kerley) Hartnell, natives of Dorsetshire, England, and is one of the representative farmers of his county.

John Hartnell was the only child of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Hartnell, who were also of English birth. They accompanied their son when he came to America in 1843, and lived on a farm in Brighton township, where both died, the father reaching the age of more than eighty years. After coming to Wisconsin John Hartnell, the son, bought 160 acres of land to which he added later until he had a farm of 360 acres, all well-improved. He came to be one of the leading men of the township, and organized the Brighton Farmers Mutual Fire Insurance Company, of which he was made president. Before leaving England he had married Eliza Kerley, one of the three children born to her parents; her father died in England in middle life. John and Eliza Hartnell had eight children: Elizabeth, Mrs. William Stevens, of Bristol township; Thomas J., deceased; Harriet, Mrs. S. S. Smith, of Nebraska;

Richard K., of Clackamas, Ore.; Mary, deceased wife of George Jordan, of Somers township; Frank G.; Frances, late wife of Samuel Munsen; and Clarence, of Oregon. The family attended the Methodist Episcopal Church. John Hartnell died April 14, 1888, aged sixty-nine years, and his wife Dec. 5, 1893.

Frank G. Hartnell has spent his whole life on the family homestead. He received his education in the district schools and then gave his entire attention to the work of farming. He has added to his father's farm until he now owns 400 acres in Section 34. He had eighty acres more, but sold that tract in 1904. Success has crowned all his efforts, and he ranks high in the community. Mr. Hartnell, who is a Republican, has always been interested in public affairs, and he served one term as chairman of the Brighton town board.

Mr. Hartnell was married, March 29, 1883, to Clara A., daughter of N. M. and Elizabeth (Castle) Burgess. They are the parents of seven children, all at home: Lora Belle, Olive Elizabeth, Hazel H., Nettie, Miner, Alta and Floyd.

Mrs. Hartnell's family came from the State of New York. Her grandfather, Daniel C. Burgess, who was born there, was a farmer and merchant. He was one of the pioneers of Salem township, but died in Michigan advanced in years. By his wife, Sylvia (Maynard) Burgess, he had three children, who went West with him. One son, N. M. Burgess, is still living in Salem township; he married Elizabeth Castle, daughter of Hastings Castle, a pioneer of the village of Bristol, and to their union came two daughters, Mrs. Hartnell and Mary Belle, wife of Ollie Castle, of California.

JOHN McBETH (deceased), a native of New York State, came West with his father when a boy, and settled in Yorkville township, Racine county, at an early date. His parents were Alexander and Elizabeth (Morris) McBeth, the former a native of Scotland, and the latter of the North of Ireland. They came to America and settled in Genesee county, N. Y., where their children were born. Mr. and Mrs. McBeth came to Racine county among the pioneers, settling in Yorkville township, on 120 acres of land. Alexander McBeth died on this place when seventy-seven years of age, his wife surviving him several years, and being eighty years old at the time of her death. Of their family of seven children but two survive, Daniel and Susan.

John McBeth was reared on his father's farm in Yorkville township, and there attended the district schools. He lived at home until grown, and after his marriage kept the county farm for some time, later becoming town clerk, a position he ably filled for a period of sixteen years. He then became route agent for the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad Company for nine years, at which time he made his home in Milwaukee. Returning to Yorkville township, he operated a farm of forty acres until his death, Jan. 17, 1895, at the age of sixty-two years.

On Feb. 28, 1860, Mr. McBeth married Miss Elizabeth Ann Dore, daughter of David and Elizabeth (Graddige) Dore. Mrs. John McBeth was born in Hartford, Conn., Jan. 14, 1838; her father was a native of the Isle of Wight, and a railroad engineer, and her mother a native of Manchester, England. Of their five children, three are now living: Emma, the wife of James

Arthur Hartnell was a prominent citizen of Salem Township serving as Town Chairman and founding the Hartnell Chevrolet dealership. Highway AH in Salem was named for Arthur Hartnell. Although descendants of John C. and Elizabeth Hartnell still remain in Kenosha County, no known Hartnells from this line have been found.

Joseph Hartnell, the fourth child of James and Sarah (nee Hartnell) was a sailor, an occupation shared by many of the English Hartnells. In the 1840/1850s he sailed between southern England and the Atlantic Provinces of Canada. In the early 1850s he met and married Anne Brown. Anne Brown was born in New Foundland, the daughter of the English born William Brown and Fanny Baker, who was also born in New Foundland. Joseph and Anne Brown Hartnell had eleven children. In 1879, after at least one child, Sarah, died in a fire, Joseph and Anne moved their family to Salem Township in Kenosha. The 1880 census lists the Joseph Hartnell family and the John C. Hartnell family as neighbors. It is not clear if all of the elder children of Joseph and Anne came to Kenosha with their parents, only the four youngest children are listed as living with their parents on the 1880 census, at least four of their five oldest sons married women from New Foundland. The third son of Joseph and Anne, Albert, cannot be accounted for, it is possible that he also died in the fire or he never came to Kenosha County. Most of the Hartnells living in Kenosha County today descend from Joseph and Anne Brown Hartnell.

Frank Hartnell, the fifth child of Joseph and Anne Brown Hartnell, came to Kenosha with his parents in 1879, but then he returned to Canada where he learned the trade of a stone mason and bricklayer. In 1885, in Perth, Canada, he married Martha Wells. Martha was born in New Foundland, the daughter of Thomas Wells, who was born in England, and Elizabeth Hollet, who was born in New Foundland. In 1889/90 Frank and Martha moved to Kenosha County and then in 1894 they returned to Canada, where they resided until 1899. In 1899 Frank and Martha returned to Salem Township and finally, in 1908, they moved to the city of Kenosha where in 1911 Martha died. Frank Hartnell married three more times: Anna who died in 1914, Margaret who died in 1917 and Elizabeth (date of death unknown).

MY FAMILY HISTORY

My grandfather, Verne Stockwell, was born to Mr. and Mrs. George Stockwell on December 24~~th~~, 1884. He was the fourth of six children. The names of his brothers and sisters are as follows, beginning with the eldest: Ivy, Philip, George, ~~Verne~~, Agnes, and Marion. Verne attended Frass Ball Grade School, which was a one room school house located on Highway 50, just west of Brassball Corners; and approximately one mile east of the family farm. He attended high school in Kenosha, but my Grandmother Stockwell cannot recall whether or not he graduated.

It seems as if Verne's father was active in politics, at least on the local level. Verne never really showed an interest in politics except for leaning toward the ^RRepublican side of the ballot.

My grandfather was a farmer for most of his life, spending most of his time as a youth on the Stockwell homestead, which my Grandmother Stockwell says, dates back as far as 1837. What is remaining of their farm is still in the Stockwell name.

He enjoyed hunting and fishing, and liked to go to Northern Wisconsin to hunt deer.

None of his sisters moved far away from home, staying in the Kenosha-Racine County area. Phil and George both spent a great deal of time in Chicago. George became a lawyer, and later lost his health and moved to Arizona.

It was there that he accidentally shot himself while cleaning his gun. Phil had returned home to run the farm after Verne left home. After leaving the farm, Grandpa did a little carpentry, mostly just helping a local builder. In about the year of 1909 or 1910, he bought the farm on which I live. He rented it out on a share-crop basis. World War I found the boys past draft-age, therefore none of them served in the armed forces.

Great-Grandfather Stockwell had one of the first automobiles in this area. It was a Ford, Model "T", which he purchased in 1912 or 1913.

Grandpa and Grandma Stockwell knew each other since childhood, growing up not more than about four miles apart. I believe that they married in the early 1920's.

My grandmother, Hazel Hartnell Stockwell, grew up in a family of seven children. She was born in 1891, on what is now the Lawrence Olsen farm located east of Highway 75 on County Trunk NN. The children were as follows, beginning with the eldest; Lora, who was later killed in an automobile accident, then Olive, Hazel, Annette (or Nettie, as Grandma always called her), Miner, Alta, and Floyd. Miner was named after Clap Miner, the man who donated the land for the Miner School, which all seven children attended. It was, and still is, located on County Trunk NN a short way west of Highway 75. All eight grades shared the same room and teacher. The building was heated by an old wood-burning, pot bellied stove that didn't seem to be doing it's job half of the time in

the cold weather.

Grandmother recalls that as a child she and her brothers and sisters had to make their own fun. The games had such names as "Auntie-I-Over" and "Pom-Pom-Pull-a-way". "Auntie-I-Over" was a game where a ball was thrown over a milkhouse or school roof to the other team. The teams would then change sides, and the person with the ball would tag people who would then join his or her side.

When going to school, they would have to walk one-half to three-quarters of a mile. Some winters they were able to run all the way on snow drifts. If the weather would get too bad, their father would come to school and get them with horses and sleigh. She recalls that the older boys would only attend school in the winter because they were needed on the farm during spring and fall.

There were always large amounts of work to be done on the farm, and everyone had to pitch in to help. No matter what the work, the girls were still expected to wear a dress. It was disgraceful to be seen in trousers. In fact, my grandmother has worn nothing but dresses to this day.

Grandmother seemed to be closest to Nettie, and they did a lot of their work together. They did things like setting cabbage plants while their father drove the team. They also helped drive the team that pulled the wagon during haying time. There were no bales. The

hay was pulled loose into the mow by big forks on pulleys and ropes pulled by horses. Slough grass was used as ice hay. The swampy ground was so soft that special wooden shoes were put on the horses. The slough hay was used as packing and insulation for ice houses.

The farm that Grandma lived on was approximately two hundred fifty acres, not including the land that her father rented. Their farming operation was quite diversified. They raised pigs, dairy and beef cattle, chickens, ducks, and sometimes even turkeys. Their crops consisted of hay, grains, cabbage, etc. Her family always raised large gardens, and fruit orchards. There were also hickory nuts and walnuts, and it was picnic time when those were gathered.

There used to be two big picnics a year, both held at Old Settler's Park at Paddock Lake. One was on July 4th., and the other was held later in August. Grandma remembers her father hitching up a team to the surrey with a fringe on it, and going to these community get-togethers. Another social event was the basket social where the young men would bid on baskets of "goodies" which had been made by the girls. "Barn raisings" were also sources of neighbor get-togethers. All would get together to help a neighbor build a barn which was needed perhaps because the original one had burned.

The roads were great as long as the weather was dry. Each farmer was responsible for maintaining the road in front of his place. Usually all that meant was dumping a load of gravel in front of his place. If he didn't do

his share, he was charged a road tax. During the winter, each farmer was expected to help keep the roads clear since there was no highway department. If roads became too bad, they would just cut a hole in a fence and go through the fields. In the spring, mud was well over a foot deep and when it dried, deep ruts were left. Each farmer would hitch a team of horses to a large grader and pull it for some distance, smoothing and mounding the road.

The telephone was one of the first conveniences showing up about 1903. Others did not appear for some time yet. For example, the milking was done by lantern light.

Grandma Stockwell graduated from grade school in 1906. The graduation ceremony took place in Old Settler's Park. She stayed home a year waiting so she could go to the College of Commerce in Kenosha with Nettie. Olive also attended the College of Commerce. Alta attended high school in Kenosha and then attended Whitewater for two years. Lora went to an academy in Rochester, Wis. until sickness forced her to leave. Floyd and Miner did not attend school beyond the eighth grade. Their father died in 1909. After his death, their family moved to Brass Ball Corners where their mother ran the inn.

In 1909 after leaving the College of Commerce, Grandma went to Silver Lake School to take her teacher's exam. While taking the test an airplane flew over and everyone ran out to see it. This was one of the first times she

had seen a plane.

She taught school at several places for about thirty dollars a month. She first taught at a school on Co. JB between Co. trunk B and highway 75, called "Twin Oaks School!" Then she taught at Brass Ball for one year, and then near the Burgess farm where she roomed for one year, then at Liberty Corners (Highway 83 and C) for three years, and finally at the Bristol School for five years. Teachers often moved to find a school where they taught the best. While teaching at Bristol, she had to walk a mile to catch a train at Salem, and then walk a mile from the train to school. She had to trudge three miles when the train couldn't get through in the winter. Grandma had to do all of her own janitor work in the school, start the fire, furnish treats for the children, etc.

Grandma married Grandpa in 1923 and lived at Brass Ball Corners for a year where Uncle Norman was born. They moved to Lily Lake where they lived for about five years, and Uncle Vernon was born there. At this time, prohibition was in full swing. Though they weren't directly affected by it, it was all around them. In fact, there were always two well dressed young men who rented a boat from them to get across the lake. There were also strange rumblings of trucks during the night, and the livestock refused to drink the water in the slough. Later, the farm across the way was raided and a still was found in the barn, using the silo as a chimney. There was another still hidden in a barn unknown until the barn burned

down around it. I guess it was too bad because the man made good stuff, since he had learned his business from a Kentucky old-timer. All told, there were about four or five stills in that area.


In 1929, my Grandfather helped complete a new home which he had had built on the farm he bought earlier. It is located on West 60th. St. or Hwy. K, west of Hwy. 75. The brick two story home cost fifteen thousand dollars at the time, and he had no trouble making payments. Helen, my Mother, was born there in 1930. All three children were born at home with Dr. Fletcher present. They attended Miner Grade School, still one room and one teacher. This was the third generation to attend that school. The above mentioned brick home was the first house that Grandma lived in that had electricity. Grandpa bought his first tractor sometime during his last few years while running the farm. It had steel wheels and was very modern then.

Norman, Vernon, and Helen all graduated from Wilmot High School. World War II was in progress, but Norman couldn't serve due to a hip ailment that caused him to be lame. Vernon was about to enter the service the year he graduated, but in October Grandpa passed away, so he stayed home to run the farm. Norman graduated from the University of Wisconsin. Mother graduated from high school in 1948 in the same class as my Father. She worked for a short while in a lumber yard office, and then in the Kenosha Co. Agricultural Extension Office for six years. Dad and Mom were married in

April, 1951. Two months later, Dad entered service during the Korean Conflict.

When Mother was small, their car was a Studebaker Erskin. When the thresher crews went from farm to farm to harvest grain, she would drive a team on the grain wagon when they were at her home. Several times a year they would drive to Kenosha. This was quite a trip, and they made a day of it, shopping and then a picnic lunch on the shore of Lake Michigan. Ice cream was a big treat, but it had to be eaten immediately, as there was no freezer space in the refrigerator. A large hard-dipped cone cost a nickel.

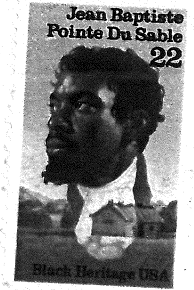
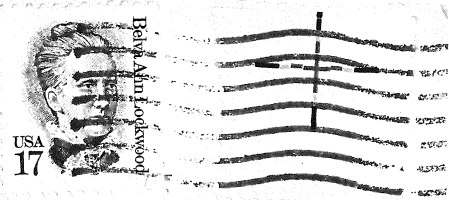
When Dad returned from service in 1953, they lived with Grandma for a year. In 1954, they moved 1/8 mi. west into the tenant house on the farm. They dairy-farmed for several years, and then switched to beef when my Dad became a Deputy Sheriff. Mother had worked in the school cafeteria since we three boys have been in school.

Except for your penchant for abbreviations and the absence of a bibliography and footnotes, this is an excellent family history paper. You cover the ground well with a good sense of perspective and at times humor!  -



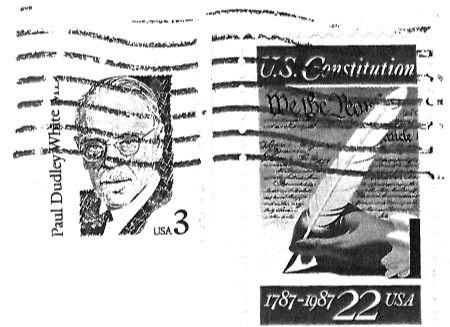

CHAPTER II

The Parents, One Generation Back

JAY WAYNE LAND

Jay Land was born in Whitewater, Wisconsin on 29 May 1919. His early years were spent in Wisconsin, Illinois, and Georgia, following the employment of his father. He graduated from the United States Naval Academy on 19 December 1941, receiving a commission as an Ensign. He spent World War II at sea aboard destroyers, during which service he was wounded. His highest military decoration was the Silver Star Medal awarded for bravery during the Battle of Okinawa. Naval service after World War II included the Korean War, the Defense of Taiwan, and four years as U.S. Naval Attache in Lima, Peru.

On 16 October 1942 he married Edna Wetzler in St. Louis, Missouri. They had two children; Dian Jeannette and Laurence (Larry) Jay. Jay remained in the Navy until 1963 when he retired, having reached the rank of Commander.

Upon retiring from the Navy, Jay moved his family to Brookline, Massachusetts. He graduated from Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts in 1965 with a Master of Arts in Teaching degree in mathematics and began teaching at Brookline High School. After various teaching positions, including two years at the International Schools of The Hague, The Netherlands, he attained the position of Assistant Professor of Mathematics at the University of Lowell, Massachusetts. He earned a Master of Science degree in mathematics from Northeastern University, Boston, Massachusetts in 1973. He attained tenure in 1973 and retired from teaching in 1977. In 1980, Jay, with his wife, removed to Fort Lauderdale, Florida, where he still resides.

EDNA LORRAINE (JEANNETTE) WETZLER (LAND)

Edna Wetzler was born on 14 October 1919 in Chicago, Illinois. Her early years and education were spent there. After graduating from Hyde Park High School, Chicago, she attended Ohio State University for two years, majoring in Fine Arts. She was a member of the Sigma Delta Tau Sorority. Until her marriage, her summers were spent at Brown's Lake, Wisconsin where her parents had a summer home and where she met her husband, Jay Land. They were married on 16 October 1942 in St. Louis, Missouri. Edna and Jay had two children; Dian Jeannette and Laurence (Larry) Jay. During World War II and the years her husband spent in the Navy, she lived wherever his services were required. Many years were spent in Coronado, California where her children were born. Another four years were lived in Lima, Peru where she was an active participant in the diplomatic life as hostess to embassy and military guests. In 1963, she with her family moved to Brookline, Massachusetts where she resided, except for two years in The Hague, The Netherlands, until 1980. In 1979, she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Fine Arts from Northeastern University, Boston, Massachusetts. In 1980, with her husband, she removed to Fort Lauderdale, Florida, where she still resides.

ABRAHAM HARTNELL

Abraham Hartnell, son of Abraham and Jane Duning Hartnell, was born around 1766 for his baptism occurred that year in Winfrith Newburgh, Dorsetshire, England. On 15 May 1786, Abraham married Margaret Meaden at Winfrith Newburgh. They had seven children; Thomas, John, Abraham, James, Mary, Joseph and Jane, all probably born in Dorsetshire. What Abraham's occupation was, when he died, or where he was buried is unknown.

Little is known about Margaret Meaden except that she married Abraham Hartnell on 15 May 1786 at Winfrith Newburgh, Dorsetshire, England. They had seven children; Thomas, John, Abraham, James, Mary, Joseph and Jane, all probably born in Dorsetshire. When Margaret died or where she is buried is unknown.

JOHN HARTNELL, SR.

John Hartnell, son of Abraham and Margaret Meaden Hartnell, was born at Chaldon Herring, Dorsetshire, England in July of 1789. In 1813 at Owermoigne, Dorsetshire he married Elizabeth Penney. It is believed that the couple had only one child, John Hartnell, Jr. At his son's birth, John was recorded as a dairyman. In 1844 after the death of John's wife, he with his son, his son's wife, and their first-born child, removed to the United States. He bought a farm in Section 34 of Brighton Township, Kenosha County, Wisconsin where he lived for the rest of his life with his son and his son's family. He died on 16 August 1879 and was buried at Salem Mound Cemetery, Salem Wisconsin.

ELIZABETH PENNEY (HARTNELL)

Elizabeth Penney was born about 1796, probably in Dorsetshire, England. In 1813 at Owermoigne, Dorsetshire she married John Hartnell. It is believed that John and Elizabeth had only one child, John Hartnell, Jr. It would also seem that Elizabeth spent all of her married life in Dorsetshire for she is listed there in the 1841 Census. There is a record of a burial of an Elizabeth Hartnell in 1843 at Wareham, Dorsetshire. This could well be Elizabeth Penney Hartnell for it appears she died before 1844 when her husband, son, and daughter-in-law migrated to Wisconsin:

JOHN KERLEY

John Kerley lived in Langton, Dorsetshire, England and is believed to have spent all of his life in his native country. He married a girl named Jane, also from England. John and Jane Kerley had three children; Eliza, Harriet (the later Mrs. W. V. Cull of Brighton, Kenosha County, Wisconsin) and one other. John died in England in middle life.

JOHN HARTNELL, JR.

John Hartnell, son of John Hartnell, Sr., was born in Dorsetshire, England on 5 September 1818. He married Eliza Kerley, also of Dorsetshire, on 8 March 1843. Then, in 1844 with his father, John Hartnell, Sr., the young couple and their young daughter, Elizabeth, came to America, where they settled with his father in Brighton Township, Kenosha County, Wisconsin. Upon the death of John, Sr., John, Jr. took over his father's farm on Section 34 of Brighton Township, where he lived thereafter. He and his wife had eight children; Elizabeth Kerley, John Thomas, Richard Kerley, Harriet Ann, Mary Luise, Frank George, Frances Eliza, and Clarence, all but Elizabeth being born in Kenosha County. John, Jr. died on 14 April 1888 and was buried at Salem Mound Cemetery, Salem, Wisconsin.

ELIZA KERLEY (HARTNELL)

Eliza Kerley, daughter of John and Jane Kerley, was born in East Burton, Dorsetshire England on 24 April 1816. She married John Hartnell, Jr., also of Dorsetshire, on 8 March 1843. Then, in 1844 with his father, John Hartnell, Sr., the young couple and their baby daughter, Elizabeth, came to America where they all settled in Brighton Township, Kenosha County, Wisconsin. Eliza and John had eight children; Elizabeth Kerley, John Thomas, Richard Kerley, Harriet Ann, Mary Luise, Frank George, Frances Eliza and Clarence, all except Elizabeth being born in Kenosha County. Eliza was a Wisconsin farmer's wife throughout her life. She died on 5 December 1893 and was buried at Salem Mound Cemetery, Salem, Wisconsin.

JOHN THOMAS HARTNELL

Tom Hartnell, son of John and Eliza Kerley Hartnell, was born on 25 July 1846 at his father's homestead in Brighton Township, Kenosha County, Wisconsin, where he grew to manhood. 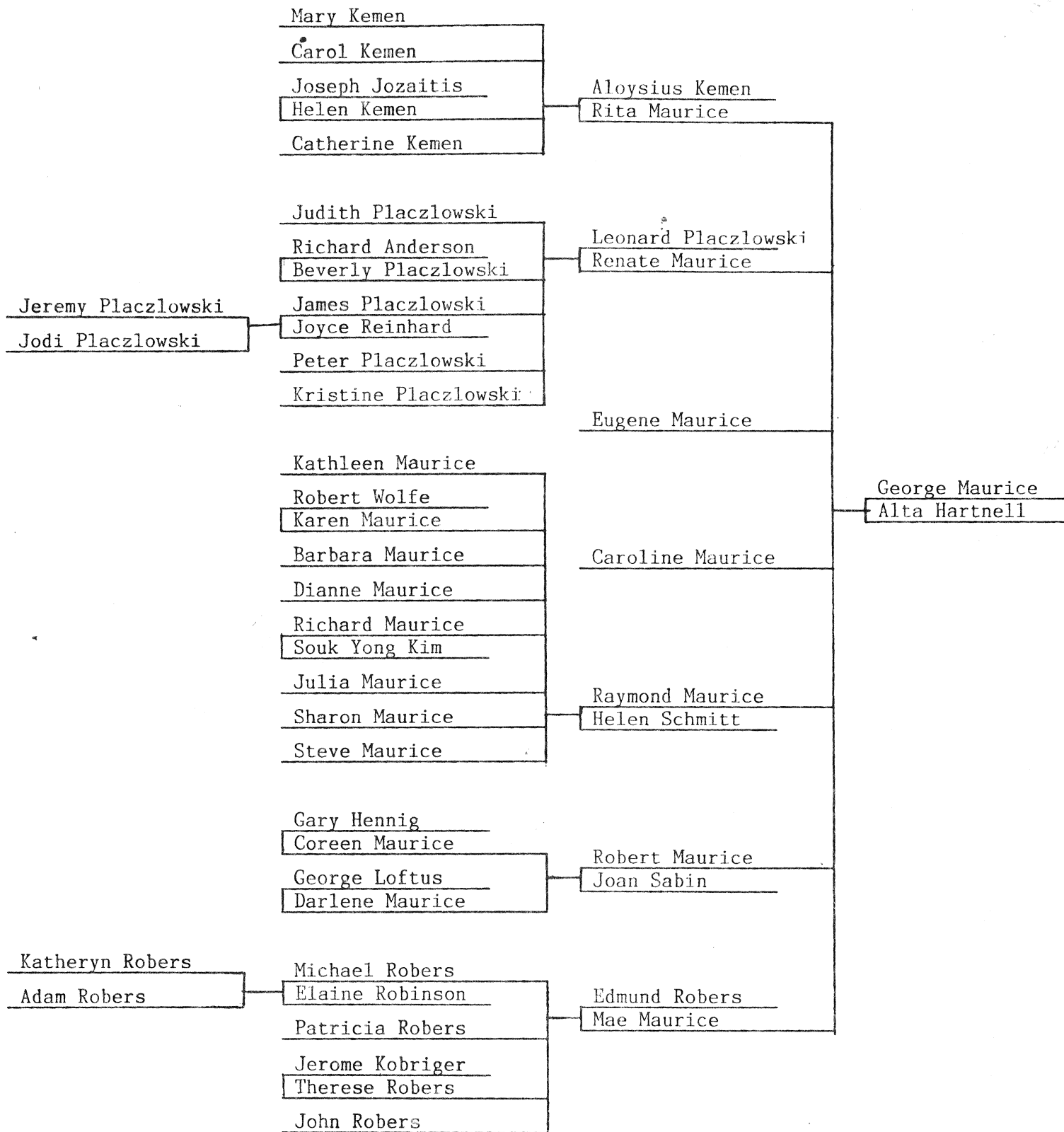

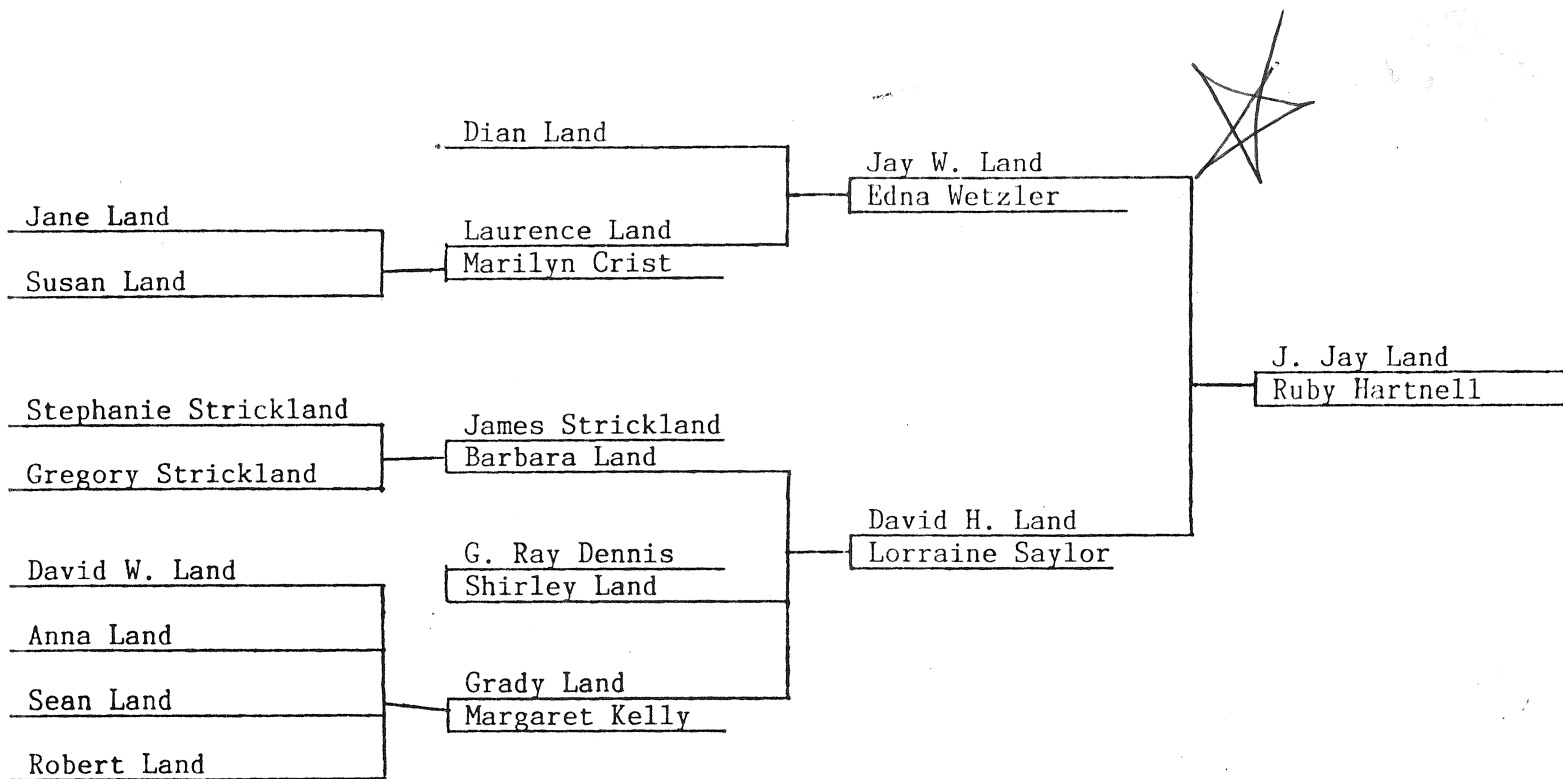

I have done a lot of research on my immediate line, which is through John Cox Hartnell, who was born in Dorset, England, and died in Salem. He owned property just north of Brass Ball Corner on the north/south road.

John Cox Hartnell's son, William, is my g-grandfather, and William and his brother, Thomas moved their families to northern Iowa, which is where my grandfather was born.

Sandi has an old photo and the only person in the photo that is known is John Cox Hartnell's grandson, Bert. I have a hunch that John and his wife are in the photo, but no way to prove it absent a contact with a family member who would have other family photos.

Miner Burgess Hartnell was born Jan 13, 1896, in Brighton Twp., the son of Frank George Hartnell, born June 17, 1855 in Brighton. Frank is the son of John Hartnell, Jr. and Elizabeth Kearley. This John Hartnell was born Sept 6, 1818, and is the son of John Hartnell, born 1789, and Elizabeth Penney. His parents were from Dorset, England, and he was born in Dorset also.

John (1789) is a brother to James Hartnell, who is the father of John Cox Hartnell. Therefore, John Jr. and John Cox Hartnell are 1st cousins.

Sandi has 3 Arthur Hartnells in my database. I have Arthur, son of James Cox Hartnell, baseborn son of Sarah Cox and James Hartnell. He was baptized the day they married.

I also have Arthur G. Hartnell, son of John Cox Hartnell and Elizabeth Harding, born in 1872 in Dorset, England.

I also have Arthur Richard Hartnell, born 1915, son of Richard Kerley Hartnell and Julia Ann Munson. Richard is a son of John & Elizabeth Penney, and brother to Frank George. He would be Miner's uncle.

Actually, I have a 4th Arthur, but I don't believe he came to the US.

John Hartnell and Elizabeth Penney are the first of the Hartnells and Penneys to come from Dorset, England to Wisconsin (that I know of). Elizabeth's brother, William Ronald Penney, came later, as did John Cox Hartnell. William Penney went through Kenosha Co., briefly to Iowa. His youngest son, Henry, had many children, one of which, Abigail Francis, married John Cox Hartnell's son William. Another of Henry's daughters, Minnie, married John Cox Hartnell's son Thomas. Abigail and William are my g-grandparents.

John Cox and Elizabeth Harding Hartnell are buried in the Liberty Cemetery, south of Salem. Their gravestone is on the far left of the cemetery towards the back, and faces the road that runs along the left (north ?) side. The

stone is large. I have a photo of it from when I visited.

I have a scanned image of John & Elizabeth & children's ship manifest when they came from England as far as Quebec in 1873. I have never been able to find how they got from Quebec to Wisconsin.

Here are quotes from my notes in my genealogy software:

The 1887 plat map for Salem shows "JCH", likely John Cox Hartnell, owning a small triangle of property north of the intersection of what is now 50 and 75/83, commonly known as Brass Ball corner. This intersection is about 2 miles north of the village of Salem. This location corresponds with a notation in the Salem United Methodist Church History that stated that the congregation first met wherever they could, sometimes in a building on the Minnis farm, later in the Congregational Church in Salem. "The small assembly building on the Minnis farm had been moved to John C. Hartnell's home one-eighth mile north of Brass Ball Corner on the west side of Highway 75." It was used for services until the first building could be built 700 feet west of Main Street given by Dr. Francis and Martha Paddock. The history states that "Most of the fund raising and labor was performed by John C. Hartnell, B.H. Stocker, W.V. Cull, David Prosser, Wm. Grant, Sr., Samuel Ripley, Wm. Hellier, John Hartnell and many others of the community."

A 1908 plat map of Salem Village shows J.C. Hartnell owning a parcel on the northeast corner of Main Street and Pleasant Street, 386' x 363'. This is the site of the original Hartnell Garage which later became Hartnell Chevrolet. Three additional plots to the north on Main Street may also have been owned by Mr. Hartnell. Mrs. Emma Kaphengst, age 95, told me on July 15, 2002, that Arthur Hartnell lived in a house on the most northern of these three plots.

John's daughter, Anna Harding Hartnell (later married Charles Findley) taught at the Brass Ball School. I have some of the school records copied from teacher's record books that are in a college library outside Kenosha. I don't remember the name of the library/college, but I have it written down somewhere.

The following list was sent to Daryle and she forwarded to me. We know that some of these people are buried in Green Ridge Cemetery, Kenosha. It may be that all are, but the cemetery name(s) weren't provided. Does anyone know Green Ridge well enough to say that the location descriptions all come from Green Ridge?

The obituary for Martha Wells Hartnell, wife of Francis "Frank" Hartnell, son of Joseph and Anna Brown Hartnell, who died April 23, 1911, says that she was buried in the "family plot of the Kenosha City cemetery." Is that a different cemetery from Green Ridge, or are they one in the same? Martha is on this list, although according to her obituary, she died on Sunday and was buried on Wednesday, which in April 1911 was the 26th.

It would be helpful to know whether this list is for people that are all in one cemetery, or not. And, if not, is there a way to tell from the location descriptions which are Green Ridge? Further, can anyone interpret the location descriptions.

For instance, Joseph (Emmanuel) Hartnell was buried Dec 27, 1960. What does 4-39-LV3 mean? What about Henry's location; 106 1/2 NW?, Franks; 8 LVI? Etc.

Per Daryle's note, she has more to add to this list.

If you have not looked at the Newfoundland Grand Banks, Newfoundland Vital Statistics petites Methodist church Baptisms 1857-1881 websight you might try it. John Hayward married mary Ann Troke. I found them listed as the parents of Rebebekah Hayward b. 3-12-63 and Baptized in 4-12-63. Other children were Mary Ann b.12/13/1856 and Baptized 11/7/1857, James b. 8/28/1860 and baptized 10/7/1860, John b. 5/3/1866 (I wrote question marks after this. Don't know why), Susan Elizabeth b. 1-3-70 baptized 3/1/1870. There were no more births after that because they went to Anticosti Island about 1873. I am in contact with K. Wayne Lester from Canada. Wayne is related somehow to the Bakers. He and his wife are going to newfoundland this month. I asked him, if he goes to the Colonial Building in St. John's, to see if he can find the book about anticosti *Island I know one igsists(sp) but I've never seen it. My husband Jeff found it one time in the library of the Colonial Building when we went to St. John's. I'm afraid that was when I was first starting on this voyage of Ancestry and didn't have enough sense to look and see what he was talking about.*

I have had a habit of collecting e-mails through inquiries even though at the time they didn't seem to connect. So when I saw the Obituary of Rebecca Hayward Hartnell wife of John A. Hartnell I recognized the name Axtell. I had connected with Tom and Janet Axtell. They told me that her g-g-grandfather was Geo. Axtell and her g-g-grandmother was Mary Ann hayward. So I backtracked and this is what I found. John and mary Ann Troke Hayward lived in Garia. They had seven children. The births and baptisms are taken from Newfoundland Grand Banks, Newfoundland Vital Statistics, Petites Methodist Baptisms, 1857-1881

Mary Ann b. 12/13/1856, bapt. 11-7-1857, James b. 8-28-1860, bapt. 10-7-1860, Rebekah (Rebecca) b. 3-12-1863, bapt. 4-12-63, John ?? b. 5-3-66, bapt. 7-19-1866, Susan Elizabeth b. 1-30-1870, bapt. 3-1-1870. This was the end of the baptisms, but not necessarily the end of the children. John Hayward was a Methodist layman and was partly instrumental to a large group of people leaving Garia, newfoundland for the Isle of Antosti. So there may be more children born in Anticosti. The Obit. mentioned two sisters, Mrs Geo. Axtell of Kenosha and Mrs. Charles Duke of Milwaukee. It mentioned two brothers james and George hayward. Rebecca Hayward married John A. hartnell and her sister Mary Ann married George Axtell. I was able to find George and Mary Axtell in the census for Prairie View (1900 which had womething to do with Kenosha) and Kenosha (1910, 1920) They lived on Fremont and New Street. They came to the U. S.A. in 1888. I guess that makes the Hayward and Axtells first cousins. Does anyone know this family?

As to the Trokes, there were 5 men named Troke in the 1871 census of Garia. Henry, James, Joseph, Samuel Jr. and Samuel Sr.

There is a very slight (and I mean slight) possibility that John Baker was from Devon, England and was b. in 1780 and possibly married martha Cox whose sister Sarah was married to James Hartnell. (Our g-grandfather joseph's parents) If this is so they emigrated to Newfoundland. There were three Baker's in the 1871 census of Garia. John , Robert, and another Robert. I have been in touch with Wayne Lester from Canada and he is visiting Newfoundland. He is going to see what he can find out. His family would be the Baker's. I asked him if he goes to the Colonial Building to see if he can find a book on the Isle of Anticosti in their library. I have also renewed my subscription to the Newfoundland Ancestor and have entered a query with all these names. there's more but I think this enough to absorb. I hope this will help someone. Daryle
