### Art

#### 111 Arts and Crafts — 1 Credit

This course outlines the basic philosophy and fundamentals of teaching art in the elementary schools, also the problem approach in working with different mediums and materials that lend themselves to the teaching of art. This includes pencil drawing, design fundamentals, printing techniques, lettering, posters, and bulletin board arrangements. Also painting and experimenting with varied materials is implemented in the program. This course is designed to help students learn through creative experience.

#### 121 Arts & Crafts — 1 Credit

This course is a continuation of Art 111 stressing creative experiences with three-dimensional material, papier-mache, paper sculpture, clay, carving and modeling, construction, simple crafts, and fingerpainting.

### Biology

#### 213 Biology — 3 Credits

This course deals with plant life, animal life, classification, physiology, basic structures, life processes, the environment, interdependence of plants and animals, use of community resources for teaching above facts, diseases, living and non-living things. One hour per week of laboratory work is required in this course.

### Conservation

#### 211 Conservation — 1 Credit

This course covers the area of conservation of water, soil, force, wild life, and recreation. A field trip in Racine and Kenosha counties to study conservation practices is taken. Wisconsin teachers must have credit in conservation to be certified as an elementary teacher by the Department of Public Instruction.

rent survey, problems in construction and all prescribed concepts developed in the elementary school arithmetic program. This course includes a study of the State Curriculum Bulletin "Arithmetic Learning Sequence for the Elementary School" as well as regular professional books. Modern mathematics is stressed in this course.

#### **213 Mathematics-Modern Methods — 3 Credits**

This course is a detailed study of the different methods of teaching arithmetic in grades one through eight. Drill devices are stressed as well as problem solving techniques. The State Curriculum Bulletin, "Arithmetic Learning Sequence for the Elementary School," is used together with professional books. Modern mathematics is stressed in this course.

### **Music**

#### **111 Music - Fundamentals — 1 Credit**

Rhythmic, melodic, and harmonic experiences are the basis of study of the necessary fundamentals of music theory. Of the four important activities in the music program, singing and playing instruments are stressed during the first semester. Major, minor and pentatonic scales are played, sung, and written. Chord construction is demonstrated on the piano and auto harp, and principles of analysis are used to improve sight singing.

#### **121 Music - Fundamentals continued — 1 Credit**

A continuation on the work with fundamentals, an introduction to the chromatic scale insofar as playing, writing, and studying its use in songs. Drill on piano, recorder, and auto harp continue to insure they will be useful in learning new songs and adding fresh interest to old ones.

#### **211 Music - Techniques of Teaching — 1 Credit**

This course is designed to acquaint the student with the importance of music in present day living, and with the teacher's responsibility in opening the door to music enjoyment and skills for all children. The most recent techniques of teaching music are used and discussed as well as demonstrated. The use of recordings to strengthen the presentation of those who lack ability is fully explored. Students make practical use of the piano cadences learned in Freshman music by creating march and waltz rhythm.

#### **221 Music Appreciation — 1 Credit**

The aim of this course is to learn to listen with intelligence and pleasure to many kinds of music and to acquire a vocabulary which will make communication with others more effective insofar as music is concerned. A knowledge of the four elements of music, the media used in performance, and the general principles of structure or form to give a deeper understanding of the values of music are integral parts of this course.

#### **110 - 120 - 210 - 220 Chorus**

Chorus is made up of the entire study body at R.K.T.C. meeting on alternate Mondays for an hour of singing in unison and in parts. This supplements the regular music classes and all full-time students are expected to be in attendance.

### **Observation of Teaching**

#### **110 Observation of Teaching - Required for all Freshmen — No Credit**

This course is designed to acquaint the students with the techniques of correct teaching, planning, testing, evaluation, room control, pupil-parent conference reports,

#### **213 English, Children's Literature — 3 Credits**

This course is designed to develop in children and our future teachers a delight in reading good literature, to appreciate cultural patterns of different people, get to know good authors, teach literature through use of audio-visual aids, dramatization, choral reading, story telling, book exhibits, puppet shows, bulletin boards, source lists of new library books, evaluation of comics, movies, radio, television, recorded literature, as well as an intensive study of children's poems.

#### **223 English, American Literature — 3 Credits**

A course designed to acquaint the students with the development of American Literature from the colonial days to the present time. It includes the reading of representative selections of various types of literature for each period in American History, the American Classics, a study of our American authors, living and dead. A study is made of magazines, newspapers, and books adapted to the elementary classrooms. Included are Current Events, Weekly Reader, Scholastic, etc.

NOTE: A term paper is required in this course.

### **Geography**

#### **113 Physical Geography — 3 Credits**

This course provides an intensive study of the features of the earth's structure, solar system, tools for the study of geography, the physical setting, climatic regions, climate controls, land forms, the earth's waters, measurement of latitude, longitude, time, natural vegetation, animal life, soil formations, and distribution.

NOTE: A term paper is required in this course.

#### **123 Economic Geography — 3 Credits**

A study of production, resources, economic needs, distribution of products, population factors of the following areas: Wisconsin, Canada, Alaska, United States, Mexico, Central America, South America, Europe, Asia, Africa, and Australia. Inter-continental trade and exchange of materials, raw and manufactured, is given emphasis.

A unit in Cooperatives is included in this course.

### **History**

#### **213 American History with European Background — 3 Credits**

A survey of American History beginning with the Exploration period and the developmental growth to 1860.

#### **223 American History — 3 Credits**

A course continuing in American History from 1860 to the present day with emphasis on the study of political parties, westward expansion, important economic struggles and wars, the expansion of the American participation to a world power.

### **Mathematics**

#### **123 Mathematics - Modern Fundamentals — 3 Credits**

This course includes a study of the mechanics of arithmetic, Grades 1-8 as taught in the elementary school. It includes addition, subtraction, fractions, decimals, ratio, insurance, commissions, taxes, discounts, measurements, budgets, formulas,



## Education

### 113 Education - Elementary Curriculum — 3 Credits

This course provides a study of the schools in our democracy, the history of the Wisconsin public school system, concepts of the new vs. the traditional schools, the scientific approach to teaching, a study of teaching techniques, goals, objectives, procedures, planning, evaluation, programming, teaching approaches, resource units, teaching units, problem approaches, grouping in the various grades, courses of study, theory and practices, uses and operation of visual aids, auditory aids, radio, audiometer, tape recorder, opaque projector, microscope, duplicating machines, etc., teaching aids, files, source and collection of free teaching aids. The State Curriculum Bulletins "Resource Units on Curriculum Development" and "I Did It This Way" are used in this course.

## English

### 113 English - Composition and Grammar — 3 Credits

A basic course to instruct students in the effective use of English. Emphasis will be on sentence and paragraph construction. Written work will stress exposition and informal argument. A unit will be included to train the student in the management of textbook and classroom libraries.

### 123 English-Oral and Written Communication — 3 Credits

This course in basic principles of speech includes methods of oral communications, public speaking techniques, conversational speech, all of which center around actual delivery. Written work will consist of organizing and writing speeches — emphasis will be on smooth and competent writing and oral expression as required by professional people.

### 113 English, Language and Communication Skills — 3 Credits

A course designed to give the prospective teacher greater confidence in thinking clearly when teaching the Language Arts, to talk effectively, to write creatively, to listen attentively, to use English correctly, develop a broad vocabulary, develop techniques of teaching spelling, develop skills in teaching penmanship, script and manuscript writing, to talk clearly, to improve study habits, to correlate the Language Arts with other subject areas and the use of work books in the Language Arts.

State Curriculum Bulletins used in this course are "Choral Speaking," "Abilities and Skills in Oral and Written Communication," "Handwriting in the Language Arts Program," "Spelling in the Language Arts Program," and "Wisconsin Children Write."

The student must complete requirements for the Zaner-Bloser penmanship certificate in this course.

NOTE: A term paper is required in this course.

### 123 English, Reading Skills and Techniques — 3 Credits

This course outlines correct techniques and methods to teach Reading in the elementary grades. Included are such factors as selection of reading books and materials, use of reading aids, tests and work books, supplementary reading materials, library reading for information, resource material, mechanical reading aids, correlation of Reading with other subjects, reading for enjoyment, phonics as a reading tool, reading tests for readiness, achievement, diagnosis of reading abilities, and the use of reading work books.

The State Curriculum Bulletin used in this course is "Organization and Administration of a Reading Program."

pupil-teacher relationships, characteristics of children at various age levels, individual differences, and sequence of learning in the elementary grades. This class meets daily for a period of thirty minutes in the campus school, where a regular elementary class is being taught by the demonstration teacher, while students carefully observe such teaching.

### 120 Observation of Teaching - Required for All Freshmen — No Credit

This course continues observation of teaching begun in Observation 110. Students observe the application of methods and techniques as taught in the methods classes. This class meets daily for thirty minutes in the campus school, where a regular elementary class is being taught by the demonstration teacher, while the students observe such teaching demonstrations.

Students are required to make written evaluations of the teaching they observed.

## Psychology

### 113 Psychology - Child Development — 3 Credits

This course is designed for the students to study general principles of child development, physical influences on growth, emotional influences on growth, nutritional influences on growth, environmental influences on growth, physical growth and use of the body, motor control, growth of sense perceptions and judgments, development of memory, imaginative and creative ability, growth of language, thinking and reasoning, social and personality development, conflict and aggression, social and personality adjustment, moral judgment and psycho-sexual development.

### 123 Psychology - Psychology of Learning — 3 Credits

This course covers the nature and scope of educational psychology, the teacher and the educative process, mental growth and the development, intelligence and its measurement, aptitude and aptitude testing, personality traits and their evaluation, educational implications of individual differences, general theories of learning, attitudes, interests, motivation, developing effective study habits, acquiring learning skills and knowledge, reflective and creative thinking, importance of transfer of learning, nature and scope of educational programs, techniques of evaluation, statistics in education, tests and measurements, adjustments of exceptional children.

NOTE: A term paper is required in this course.

## Physical Education

### 111 Physical Education — 1 Credit

This course includes the scope and sequence of physical education in our schools. It covers the background of physical education including history of physical education, political, social and religious contributions, trends in physical education, playgrounds, and supervision, Wisconsin requirements in the physical education courses. Seasonal games are stressed also.

### 121 Physical Education (Health & Safety - First Aid) — 1 Credit

This course teaches our students the basic principles of First Aid, and how to use these principles in their daily lives. The Red Cross First Aid Manual is used as the basic textbook.

This course is designed to teach students the significance of health in daily living, personal health, and the scope of the school health program. Health and safety laws are stressed also. Methods of teaching and safety are a part of this course.



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**211 Physical Education — 1 Credit**

This course is planned to familiarize students with plays and games, folk dancing, rhythm games, square dancing, singing games, dramatic and creative rhythms, line and circle dances, folk dance records, stunts and tumbling and calisthenics. These activities are planned for inside play or gymnasiums where available.

State bulletin used in part of this course is: "Physical Education Handbook for Wisconsin Schools."

Note: In lieu of the regular semester examination, the student may present a folder or file of teaching materials and aids he has gathered and organized that will assist him in teaching of physical education in elementary schools. At least a hundred different folk dances, rhythm games, reels, circle dances, etc., must be outlined herein, with teaching methods to teach same.

**221 Physical Education — 1 Credit**

This course outlines plays and games for elementary school children, playground design and equipment, methods of teaching physical education activities, materials and equipment, activities and games for each of the elementary grades, direction of such games as baseball, softball, tennis, volleyball, hockey, horseshoes, calisthenics, action games, relays, ball handling, and climbing.

State curriculum bulletins "Physical Education Handbook for Wisconsin Schools" and "Grow Up With Jim and Jean" are used in this course. "Elementary School Playgrounds" is also used for planning a playground.

Note: In lieu of the regular semester examination, the student may present a folder or file of teaching materials and aids he has gathered and organized that will assist him in teaching this area of physical education in the elementary schools. At least a hundred games or activities must be outlined with teaching methods to teach same. Diagrams of playing courts must be included.

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**Practice Teaching****212 Practice Teaching — 2 Credits (First Semester, Sophomore Year)**

This course provides practice teaching in actual classroom situations in elementary schools in the county in which the student resides, under selected host teachers, for a period of three to four weeks during the month of November. The student is under the supervision of the host teacher, who regularly teaches these grades, as well as personnel from this college who make regular visits with the student and report on his or her progress. Conferences with the host teacher and the visiting teacher from this college provide evaluation of the student's progress in his or her teaching ability. Two credit hours are earned in this course; one by doing student teaching in our campus school and one credit by doing student teaching in an area school in November.

**222 Practice Teaching — 2 Credits (Second Semester, Sophomore Year)**

This course continues the practice teaching program begun in 212 Practice Teaching in a different school, however, and with a different host teacher for a three to four week period during the month of March. Superintendents and principals are informed of this practice teaching period, so that our students can be visited by school administrators and supervisors for possible future placement in teaching positions. Two credit hours are earned in this course; one by doing student teaching in our campus school and one credit by doing student teaching in an area school in March.

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## Science

### 213 Biology — 3 Credits

(Same as 213 Biology listed under Biology.)

### 223 Physical Science — 3 Credits

This course gives the student an insight into teaching the basic principles of science on the elementary school level. It covers such areas as matter, energy, heat, light, electricity, magnetism, sound, chemical and physical changes, experiments and demonstrations, etc. Methods of teaching science in the elementary schools are included in this course.

One hour of laboratory work per week is required in this course.

## Sociology

### 223 Sociology — 3 Credits

A study of the social interactions of man and his environment as influenced by the factors of culture, behavior, human nature, social institutions, social changes, community relationships, social satisfaction, mobility, standards of living, rural and urban differences, migration, pressure groups, labor problems, the church in the community, the school and its place in community living.

## Audio-Visual

### 120 Audio-Visual — No Credit

A course in the use of audio-visual equipment is required which is non-credit and convenes for 15 sessions during the second semester of the freshman year. A certificate for successful completion is awarded.

Dormitory rooms and board are provided for by an official contract between this college and the student on a semester period basis only. All contracts must be signed by the parent or guardian of the student and be in the college office before the semester opens. Contract forms are furnished by this college. No exceptions are made except in emergency or unusual cases. No student may break the contract for board and room after a contract has been made. Penalty for breaking a contract will be nullification of all college credits earned during such terms.

No deductions are made for meals and room for the first day of an absence period. After the first day's absence, however, a deduction of \$2.00 per day will be allowed. A charge of \$1.00 per night will be made for rooms held for students during their absence for other than school planned trips.

Students may move into the dormitory at any time, but must reside there after once moving in until the end of a semester.

## CONCLUSIONS

In view of the critical shortage of teachers and the availability of this college at a very nominal cost to the residents of the area, it is the opinion of the Board of Trustees and the faculty that this college affords an excellent opportunity for those individuals who are truly interested in becoming elementary teachers to begin their formal training at this college. There, of course, has been a good deal of publicity concerning the closing of the county colleges in June of 1971; however, the last graduation, if conducted in 1971, will still allow those graduates seven years to achieve their Bachelor's Degree. There is a critical shortage of teachers and we are finding that the demands on the part of district administrators for graduates from this college have been increasing each year.

are offered. The Board of Trustees reserves the right to increase the weekly rate if economic conditions warrant, providing residents are notified one semester in advance.

The dean of women resides in Storms Hall and is directly responsible for its day-by-day operation. Also, a full-time housekeeper resides at the dormitory and is responsible for the maintenance of the building. A full-time cook prepares the meals for the students.

Each of the women students is provided with a private room which is quite pleasant and can be made a home-away-from-home.

The college provides the beds, chairs, dressers, desks, lamps, and one blanket. Students furnish their own bed linen, bedspread, towels, drapes, etc.

Students assume the responsibility for the care of their own rooms. Periodic inspections of the rooms are made by the dean of women.

There is no college housing for the male students attending R.K.T.C.; however, rooms can be rented in Union Grove at a rather reasonable rate. Some of the male students who reside in the Union Grove area are allowed to take their meals at the dormitory providing they meet the schedule as outlined by the college administration.

There is a hand book for the residents of Storms Hall which is made available to each student who resides in the dormitory.

### COMMENCEMENT

All graduates from R.K.T.C. shall participate in the commencement exercise. January graduates will participate in the exercise following their graduation. Caps, gowns, and programs are supplied by the college.

## The Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College And Its Services

The Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College was planned and organized by joint action of the Racine-Kenosha County Boards in 1916 to provide the training and practice necessary to qualify people for teaching in the elementary schools of Wisconsin. Since the date of its establishment approximately 2,000 students have been graduated from this college and qualified for teacher certification. This college has routinely attempted to provide the type of training for students who seek preparation and qualification to teach in the elementary schools of Wisconsin by upgrading and revising the curriculum to be in harmony with what is considered good practice in teaching elementary children today.

### LOCATION

The Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College is located in the city of Union Grove at the intersection of Highways 11 and 45, about twelve miles directly west of the city of Racine. It is within convenient driving distance of Kenosha, Milwaukee, Racine, Burlington, Waterford, Rochester, Waukesha, Elkhorn, Lake Geneva, Delavan, and other neighboring communities.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Any person who has been graduated from a recognized four-year high school is eligible for admission to this college providing that he has ranked in the upper three-quarters of his high school graduating class. Applicants for enrollment must be of good moral character. The applicant must present his high school transcript of credits when seeking admission. High school graduates with poor grades usually are not successful in this school since this is a highly concentrated course offering which allows for no electives.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR ADULT SPECIAL STUDENTS AND VETERANS

Applicants for admission who are not high school graduates may be admitted to this college as adult specials on a probationary status. Such candidates must be 21 years of age or over. Veterans may be enrolled under the appropriate public laws concerning education for veterans of the armed forces if they have satisfactorily passed the Army G.E.D. test. All students who enroll as "Adult Specials" or G.E.D. candidates must maintain a 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale just as other students who are enrolled at this teacher training institution.

### STUDENT MEDICAL EXAMINATION REQUIRED

A medical examination is required of all students on a form provided by the college. The student must have his or her family doctor complete this examination, and present the completed form when enrolling. A chest X-ray must be included in the medical examination. Previous medical examinations will be accepted if not older than one year and if a chest X-ray is included.

Necessary forms relating to enrollment are available at the back of this catalogue.

## REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

Students who have completed our two-year teacher training course are eligible for graduation from this college. The student who seeks a diploma, however, must have been in attendance here for at least one college year, or a total of two semesters. Sixty-nine college credit hours are required for graduation. Our graduates are qualified to teach in elementary schools in Wisconsin, grades one through eight; however, some of the larger school districts are now requiring a Bachelor's Degree when employing elementary teachers. All graduates of the county college program must achieve the Bachelor's Degree within seven years from the date of graduation from the county college. This, then, means that a graduate of 1970 would be required to have the Bachelor's Degree by July 1 of 1977.

Students who transfer to the Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College from other colleges must present a transcript of their record and if the courses taken are in harmony with the requirements of this college and are at a level of C or better, a transfer can be made. Students in all cases must have a 2.0 grade point average or higher to qualify for a diploma from this college.

## OUT-OF-STATE STUDENTS ACCEPTED

Out-of-state students who meet the regular requirements as stated above are welcome to attend this college. Such students will have to pay the regular \$50.00 semester fee for books, insurance, etc. In addition, such out-of-state students must pay a tuition fee of \$200.00 per semester or \$400.00 per year, or actual costs as established by the auditor, whichever is greater. The Board of Trustees reserves the right to alter this charge. Such fees and tuition must be paid for the semester at the time of enrollment.

Our graduates are teaching in other states at the present time with the two years of preparation granted at this college; however, an out-of-state student should check with his Department of Public Instruction to determine if two-year graduates can be licensed in the state of their residence.

## STUDENT FEES AND TUITION

All students are required to pay a semester fee of \$50.00 which provides for all textbooks, library privileges, social fees, insurance, etc. These are paid at the beginning of each semester at the time of registration after the student has been accepted by the college. There are no other fees. Part-time students who are attending this college will be charged \$3.00 per credit hour. The minimum charge for part-time students is \$10.00 per semester. The Board of Trustees reserves the right to alter this charge providing notice is given one semester prior to change. Students who are residents of Wisconsin pay no tuition individually; however, tuition is billed to the county in which a student lives, as provided in the Wisconsin Statutes.

## LATE ENROLLMENTS

Students will be accepted for enrollment in any semester until 4:00 P. M. of the seventh class day after the opening of the semester. No enrollments will be taken after this date.

## STUDENT ACTIVITIES

A number of student activities are conducted at the college each year. The Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College has been involved in basketball for the men and volleyball for the women. The college takes part in the state basketball and volleyball tournament which is conducted in February of each year at Sheboygan Falls. The athletic director is responsible for the implementation of the athletic program, both for men and women. The academic requirement for participation is a 2.0 grade point average.

This college also participates in the forensic contest conducted by the county colleges of Wisconsin, and sends representatives to the state tournament in music and forensics.

An operetta is held each year and the responsibility for this program is delegated to the music department. At the time of the operetta an open house is also held when parents of the students at this college can visit the facilities as well as Storms Hall, a dormitory for women.

A Christmas Banquet is held in early December and all students are invited to attend. A spring formal or prom is also a part of the school activities at R.K.T.C.

## S.N.E.A. STUDENT CHAPTER

The National Education Association granted a charter to our local college in 1957. A large percentage of the students regularly join the S.N.E.A. and are then eligible to participate in the Wisconsin Education Association convention in November as well as receive the subscription to the National Education Journal. A faculty member acts as advisor to the group.

## STUDENT FORUM

An all-student forum is a part of the extra-curricular activity of this college. Forum meets approximately twelve times a year at which time resource people are brought in to speak to the students on matters pertinent to elementary education. In all cases an effort is made to provide interesting and meaningful programs through the forum. The college students choose the forum officers and the officers work with the administration in selection of the programs.

## COLLEGE CAFETERIA

The Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College provides a noon lunch through the facilities of our college cafeteria at a very reasonable rate. Students may buy a weekly ticket or a daily ticket providing the purchases are made prior to 11:00 A. M. on any given day.

## FRESHMAN-SOPHOMORE AWARDS BANQUET

Before the close of each school year our freshman class honors the sophomore class with a freshman-sophomore banquet. At this time all special awards, scholastic as well as athletic, are made to our students.

## STUDENT HOUSING

Storms Hall is operated by the Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College for women students on a five-day basis. The present rate is \$15.00 per week for Mondays through Fridays with three meals served each day excepting Friday when two meals

At the end of each semester a regular examination is administered in each subject by the instructor of the various courses on a regularly scheduled testing basis. Such tests shall cover the scope of the courses taught. Final test grades will count about one-third of the final grade in any course. All tests are filed in the office files by the instructor and shall remain the property of the college. No semester tests are returned to the students. All tests are prepared, graded, and recorded in the strictest confidence. Each student has the right to discuss the final grade administered by the instructor with the faculty member involved.

Students whose academic work is incomplete in a course at the time of a semester examination will not be permitted to take the exam in such course unless the faculty member involved recommends to the college president that the student be permitted to take the examination.

### THE CAMPUS SCHOOL

The purpose of the Campus School is to provide facilities for observation of teaching by our students as Freshmen, as well as actual practice teaching as Sophomores. The Campus School is an integral part of our college. Approximately 60 elementary children are enrolled in grades one through eight with the primary room including grades one through four and the upper grade room accommodating grades five through eight. Additional smaller practice rooms are adjoining to the Campus School rooms in which student teachers can work with small groups or classes of children when doing their student teaching.

Freshman students are required to observe demonstration classes taught daily in the Campus School from 9:00 to 9:30. This gives them a chance to observe technique and procedures and make evaluations in a conference that is routinely scheduled for each Friday with the demonstration teachers. Experience has proven that this observation program is most worthwhile in preparing the student for the second year at this college when he will be doing his actual student teaching.

Freshman students are also given the opportunity to work as assistants with the faculty members of the Campus School in such areas as playground duty and other involvement as assigned.

### PRACTICE TEACHING

Each student is required to earn four semester credits in practice teaching as seniors at this college. There are two periods established during which time the students are assigned to schools in the area of Racine and Kenosha Counties. It is hoped that we will be able to place the students in their home district insofar as possible and if the student so desires. The fall period is conducted the first four weeks of November with the spring period running for three weeks in March and April.

Also, all second-year students are scheduled for practice teaching in the Campus School and will accomplish approximately 120 clock hours of student teaching at the college.

During the practice teaching sessions our students are supervised by faculty members from this college as well as the cooperating teacher and the local district principal or administrator. Opportunities are provided for school district administrators and school board members to observe and acquaint themselves with the students during their practice teaching assignment. This area of instruction at this college is most important since it determines whether or not a person should be certified as an elementary teacher in the state of Wisconsin.

### FEE REFUNDS

If and when a student has been accepted and paid his \$50.00 semester fees but does not report for any classes, a \$40.00 refund will be made to such student upon a written request. Students who drop out of college within the first four weeks of a semester will be refunded \$25.00 of the semester fees paid. No refunds will be made for drop-outs after this period. All books and loan materials must be returned before any refunds are made. When a part-time student drops classes within the four weeks after the beginning of a semester, one-half of the fees paid will be refunded upon a written request by the student. No refund will be made after that four-week period.

### STUDENT LOANS

Students attending the Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College may secure loans through the state student loan program with a maximum allowance of \$1,000.00 per year. Further information concerning this matter can be obtained at the college central office.

### FREE PLACEMENT SERVICE

The Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College keeps in contact with superintendents and principals of schools in the surrounding counties. Many school boards, principals, and superintendents contact this college when recruiting elementary teachers. The central office maintains a file of credentials for all graduates who take action insofar as completing necessary forms and requesting letters of references from host teachers, faculty members, and other individuals who know and can give a valid recommendation for the graduate.

### CERTIFICATION FOR TEACHING

Courses offered at the Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College concentrate on the methods and techniques of teaching at the elementary level with a substantial offering in the academic area such as science, English, psychology, etc. Our graduates are qualified to teach in any elementary school in Wisconsin. All graduates must be certified by the president of the college and upon application to the Department of Public Instruction are issued a two-year teaching license, and after that a five-year license. Before the five-year license is issued by the Department of Public Instruction, each graduate must have earned six additional college credits, either in a summer school, extension courses, or night school classes. As stated above, all graduates must do additional work to acquire a Bachelor's Degree within seven years after graduation from the county college.

### COLLEGE EVENING CLASSES

For teachers and students who seek additional college credit, this college is sponsoring evening college classes. Subjects are offered in various areas of the college curriculum. Six college hours of credit can be earned per semester in evening classes toward further certification in order to qualify for a diploma. It is a requirement of the Board of Trustees that ten or more people request a course before the course can be offered and the fee charge has been established at \$10.00 per credit hour. No more than 34 credits can be earned in this manner for graduation at this college.

## TRANSFER OF CREDITS TO A FOUR-YEAR UNIVERSITY

Graduates from the Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College are accepted as third year students or juniors at our state university system providing they continue their study in the field of elementary education and have maintained a satisfactory grade point average as required by the college or university of their choice. For the most part, the nine (9) state universities will credit the graduate from this college with 64 semester credits providing all grades were C or better, which means that the student should achieve the Bachelor's Degree in two additional years of training or eight summer sessions.

It is suggested that upon graduation from the Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College that the student make contact with the college or university of his choice and have a program outlined for him to insure that the program will be realistic.

## TRANSFER AND TRANSCRIPTS

The Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College will accept or transfer college hours of credit. Individuals who wish to transfer credits to this college for possible attendance here must have such credits evaluated at this institution. This college, however, will not accept credits for courses taken at other colleges in which a grade of less than C was earned. A program of future study will be outlined for the student working toward certification to teach or for graduation from this college by the administration.

When transcripts are requested to be mailed to other colleges by our students, a charge of \$1.00 is made for all such transcripts except for the first transcript made, for which there is no fee.

## PROBATION

If a student does not maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or better in any given semester he will be placed on probation for one semester during which time he is required to improve his grade point to a 2.0 average to be retained for the following semester.

In some cases students are accepted at this school who have ranked in the lower quartile of their high school graduating class if their high school principal and guidance counselor will indicate by letter that the student has promise and should be given the opportunity to attempt college work. Such students are enrolled on a probationary basis.

## CLASS ATTENDANCE

Because regular and punctual attendance is so necessary in order to be successful at this or any college, it is urged that all students take it upon themselves to be present at all times when classes are being convened. This is a matter of importance, yet it is the responsibility of the student to fulfill his own obligation to himself and to the courses in which he is enrolled. Roll call is taken in each class by the instructor and does have a definite impact upon the final grade that a student will earn at this college. In short, each student is investing his time and money to attend this school and if class attendance is irregular, this will have an adverse effect insofar as success is concerned.

## GRADING SYSTEM

The Racine-Kenosha County Teachers College grades as follows:

A grade point of 2.0 or higher must be maintained in order that a student may complete his academic work for graduation. An incomplete may be made up when done so during the semester following the one in which the incomplete was recorded. Instructors grade on a modified curve when grading students.

## HONOR STUDENTS

Students who receive a grade point average of 3.6 or better at the end of a semester are considered honor students. Their names are posted on our honor roll. A student who is an honor student during all four semesters will be awarded a special honor pin at the time of his graduation.

## QUALIFIED HIGH SCHOOL TEACHERS MAY CONVERT TO ELEMENTARY TEACHERS

Conversion to teaching in the elementary grades for qualified high school teachers requires either the completion of the plan for such conversion as established by a college of the applicant's choice or the completion of the following courses:




